On our way back from the wedding, we stopped in Truckee, CA, to see the Teeter cemetery plot of Martha's 3rd-great uncle, Sheriff Jake Teeter, who was killed in a shootout. If you ever get to Truckee, there's a Sheriff Jacob Teeter exhibit in the Old Jail (oldest in CA) on Jaboom St.

Well, the little town of Truckee was having its own "Hands Off" protest! So John joined the line of active protesters on the street. Later in the fall, Simone got a state job in Sacramento, and currently Ian and Simone are renting a house in east Davis (we live in west Davis.). It's good to be so close – a lot better than Simone's six-hour drive from Bodie!



In late April, John and I both crossed the country to our 400-acre farm in Mustoe, VA – John direct and Martha via Cape Cod and to visit her son Charlie DuRand in Florida. Simone went along, which was especially nice.

Martha was looking forward to seeing the native plants she had planted last year on a steep hillside (about 1200 sq ft). It was doing great! In late July and August, it was an intense highway attracting bees, wasps, and butterflies.
